

The Rotary Club of San Juan

Spouse Membership

1. Approval. A spouse or partner can become an eligible member of the Rotary club by having a spouse or partner who is already a regular club member.
2. Inductions. A spouse member will be formally inducted into the club as is done by any other regular member.
3. Attendance. The attendance requirement for a spouse member is the same as any other regular member.
4. Classification. The classification of the spouse member will be established by the club. Because a spouse member is an official member of the Rotary club, this classification will be counted toward the classification limits set forth in the RI Constitution, Article 5, Section 2(b).
5. RI registration. Each spouse member will be listed as an official member of the Rotary club and will be noted in the roster that they are the spouse or partner of the regular member.
6. Badges. Badges will be the same as any other regular member.
7. Votes and quorum. For the purpose of general meetings and club matters, spouse member voting will be the same as any other regular member. As official members of the Rotary club, spouse members would apply toward RI election voting.
8. Holding office. Each spouse member, as an individual, can hold any office in the Rotary club to which the designee is elected in the normal way. The regular member and the spouse cannot both hold an office at any one time.
9. Financial obligations. The financial obligations of a spouse member may be as follows:
 - a. Initiation fee: there will be no initiation fee
 - b. RI dues: Payable for each member as stipulated in RI Bylaws 17.030.
 - c. Annual club dues: Each spouse member will pay the annual club dues of \$50 per quarter plus \$25 per quarter as a sustaining Paul Harris member.
 - d. Meal/beverage costs: Each spouse member will pay only when they attend, by cash or check.
 - e. Conversion from spouse member to regular member: This is an allowable option for the spouse member, if the regular member leaves the club or passes away.

10. Bulletin and communication. Each spouse member will receive the club's weekly bulletin/newsletter and regular club communications the same as any other regular club member.
11. Receipt of The Rotarian or Rotary regional magazine. Each spouse member will receive the RI magazine the same as any other regular club member.
12. Public liability cover. The spouse member will be included under the respective club liability insurance while participating in any approved club activities or projects.
13. Participation in youth activities. The spouse member is expected to abide by all restrictions, policies, and procedures with respect to club activities involving youth.
14. Termination. The process for terminating the membership of a spouse member is the same as any other regular club member.
